2019 Year in Review, by AVRE President/CEO, Ken Fernald

Over 94 years ago, AVRE was formed with a focus on creating employment opportunities for individuals who are blind in Binghamton. With the start of a new decade, I think about our founders and what they would think of AVRE now, and what we have become as an organization. I think they would be excited about our modern facilities (still located in downtown Binghamton), the fact we offer a range of vision rehabilitation services across nine New York counties, and the growth in employment opportunities for people who are blind or visually impaired at all levels of our organization.

Last year our Business Division continued to break records in employment, production levels, and sales. Our team worked hard to develop and start-up a new production line to supply heavy duty tarps designed to cover military vehicles. This new product line helps us to further diversify our product offering, our customer base, and the types of jobs available for individuals who are blind or visually impaired. Our Quality Management System was certified to meet ISO 9001:2015 standards, assuring the highest quality for our customers. We also focused on improving our on-time delivery rating and are now exceeding 98% on a consistent basis.

In May 2019, we held our 2nd Annual Dining in the Dark fundraiser. Around 200 guests donned a sleep shade, received instruction from our vision rehabilitation professionals, and joined us for a dinner in the dark. The funds raised from this event support the services our Health and Rehabilitation Services professionals deliver throughout our communities. More importantly, guests left with a better understanding and appreciation for some of the challenges faced by people who are blind and how AVRE can assist people to overcome those challenges.

In 2019, AVRE was ranked as #4 in the Top 50 Best Nonprofits to Work For in the nation. This is significant in many ways, but it speaks volumes about the workplace culture and overall quality work environment we have all created. Thank you to our employees, our Boards of Directors, and leadership team for making AVRE such an awesome place for each of us to do our work. In the new decade, I look forward to new opportunities, getting past the challenges, and celebrating our successes.




Sharing Snowflakes
